## **Twinning with Haybes**

Further to the formal approval by the Town Council of Poynton's twinning with the town of Haybes in the French Ardennes district, the Twinning Association of Poynton (TAP) hosted a delegation of visitors from Haybes in early July, led by their Mayor, M. Benoit Sonnet. There was a packed four day programme of visits and events to showcase Poynton's heritage and various attractions in the surrounding area. A particular highlight was an official reception at Poynton's Civic Hall at which the Mayors of Poynton and Haybes, Cllr Mrs Sandra Horsman and M. Benoit Sonnet, signed the Twinning Agreement, a successful conclusion to all the work and prior contacts made between Poynton and Haybes.

The Twinning Association was delighted to welcome its new found European friends and twinning partners, and now looks forward to a successful and lasting friendship between the two communities.

The TAP Committee will place particular emphasis on a schools' exchange programme, and will also actively promote cultural and other links between societies and organisations in both our communities where there are common interests. The Committee would also encourage Poynton's residents to visit and discover Haybes for themselves, to realise the benefits of twinning, and take advantage and build on the relationships and goodwill that already exist.

## **Closure of Poynton NatWest bank branch**

Poynton Town Council, alongside local businessman Keith Lambert (of Mates DIY shop) and David Rutley MP, met recently with National Westminster Bank to urge them not to close their Poynton Branch. We believe that this will cause serious problems for the many local people and businesses who bank there. Travel to the NatWest branches at Hazel Grove, Bramhall and Macclesfield involves journeys of several miles along heavily congested roads. Poynton has many older people who do not use online banking, and shops need to deposit cash and cheques each evening.

Despite a petition of two thousand names collected by Keith Lambert, we regret that the bank has ignored the strength of local opinion and refused to reconsider their decision. They have agreed to explore ideas put forward in an attempt to mitigate some of the effects of the closure and we are awaiting their proposals.

### Police and Crime Commissioner's consultation

David Keane, the new Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), has launched a public consultation to listen to the views of stakeholders and the wider Cheshire public, to ensure

## **National Scams Awareness Month**

Citizens Advice and Trading Standards are running their National Scams Awareness Month (SAM16) in July. A scam is a scheme designed to con you out of your money and may arrive by post, phone or email. The campaign aims to give consumers the skills and confidence to identify a scam, share experiences and take action by reporting suspicious activity, the prevention of residents becoming scam victims and identifying and supporting known and suspected scam victims. It is believed only 5% of scams are reported.

If you are concerned about a scam or possible scam, drop-in to the CAB at the Civic Hall on Tuesdays from 9.30am to 12.30pm, Wednesdays from 6pm to 8pm or Thursdays 11am to 12.30pm, or make an appointment for Thursday before 11am on 01625 872238.
